Purple Room News

This term, Purple Room students have been learning about Jandamarra, a brave Aboriginal leader who fought to protect his land and people. Through reading, videos, and class discussions, the students have gained a good understanding of his life and why he is an important figure in history.

Using what they have learned, the students have been writing their own factual recounts. They are practicing how to put events in order, write clear sentences, and include important facts about Jandamarra's story. Many students have done a great job describing key moments, like his leadership and his fight to protect his culture.

Teachers have supported the students throughout the writing process, helping them plan, write, and improve their work. The students have enjoyed sharing their knowledge and understanding on this topic with the class and are proud of how well they can tell Jandamarra's story.

This project is helping Purple Room students build strong writing skills while learning to respect and appreciate Aboriginal history and culture.

Blue Room News

Mathematics

Our Year 2 mathematicians have been busy partitioning two-digit numbers into tens and ones. They have also been working on addition and subtraction fact families to 20, 50, and some to 100.

Meanwhile, Year 3 students have been learning to partition three-digit numbers into standard and non-standard forms (e.g. 234 = 2 hundreds, 3 tens and 4 ones, or 23 tens and 4 ones). They have also applied this knowledge to three-digit subtraction requiring trading.

Literacy

In Literacy, both Year 2 and Year 3 students have commenced their study of Diary of a Wimpy Kid by Jeff Kinney. We are exploring themes such as friendship, social status, bullying, family dynamics, and the struggle for independence and identity. In reading, we have been focusing on fluent reading — the ability to read with accuracy, speed, and expression to support comprehension.

Science

This term, students have begun studying Chemical Sciences, starting with an Oobleck experiment this week. The staffroom looked like a flour bomb had exploded, and the kids went home a bit messy — but plenty of fun and learning were had by all! They observed how temperature and force changed the look and feel of the Oobleck.
